


Crusaders in Pictures

Last Sunday at the 9:30 AM Mass, our Confirmation candidates were enrolled in preparation for Confirmation. Those wishing to be confirmed at St. Henry attended Mass with their parent/s and Confirmation sponsor. After the homily, Fr. Lauer called them forward and asked a series of questions asking if they were ready to acknowledge God's love for them by committing to a life of service and love, peace, and justice to all and if they were willing

to deepen their personal commitment to Jesus Christ and take responsibility for the gifts of the Spirit in order to help the Kingdom of God. To the parents and sponsors, he asked if they were willing to help guide the candidates for Confirmation in the name of this Christian community, and to the parish community, he asked if they will continue to renew their own faith in the spirit of their own Confirmation. He also asked that we all support these young men and women of our Christian community as they follow Jesus and His Gospel. The students were then presented to the congregation the candidates "who seek to deepen their commitment and become full members of the Church by receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Cafeteria News




