The Empowering God's Children Safe Environment Program will provide its first training to our students from 11/11/24-11/22/24. The goal is to assist in the monumental mission of protecting children from abuse. Our trained staff will be delivering one safe environment lesson to your youth to support them in learning about their safety rights and boundaries, so that they have tools to protect themselves. Lessons are age-appropriate and designed to help our children recognize their boundaries and empower them to protect themselves when safe adults are not immediately available. If parents DO NOT want their child to participate in this training, they may fill out an opt-out form linked <u>HERE</u>. The lesson will then be emailed home for the parent to provide.

One of our favorite traditions is READING BUDDIES! Our older students pair up with the younger students and read together, even outside!






First Annual St. Henry Christmas Cookie Pack

That wraps up a great golf season for the Crusaders.


